# **Entrance project funding**

As a result of your membership, we secured £35K with our bid for funding to upgrade the entrance area of the Park and will be spending the money on various projects taking account of your views and wish-lists. This is a big project for our small Group to take on and obviously involves a lot of regular liaison with the Council and all the contractors involved. Although many of the quotations are in, we are still awaiting some approvals but you should be seeing improvements between now and the next eight months. So - thank you to all members.

# **Management of the Parc**

Mr Rob Jones, Team Leader on the Parks Department Management took over responsibility for Cefn Onn just over a year ago and what a difference he is making. Thank you Rob, gardeners and apprentices.



Work continues removing infected rhododendron but Rob has also been keen to open up the park allowing the eye to appreciate the varied shrub and tree species along with the views surrounding the park. Whilst regular

walkers were nervous nothing would be left, most are now full of praise and we are receiving regular appreciation on the ever improving state of the park.

# Calling all gardeners

Through the development of this close relationship, Rob has agreed to allow a monthly weekday workdays



(possibly a few hours on a Wednesday) for members who have asked to be hands-on involved but owing to family commitments, cannot work Sundays. These Workdays will start in the new year. To avoid sending a round-robin to all members with details, could you email me to express your interest. Rob would like the Friends group to take ownership of the rockery opposite the entrance to the Summer House and the main pond and they will be clearing, replanting and maintaining this area.

# Workdays this autumn/ winter

Our volunteers have been tremendous. Owing to the exceptionally wet summer the woodland paths were suffering and the volunteers have worked very hard improving surfaces and whilst there is still a lot to do, we feel sure you appreciate the work already done. The Workdays are generally attended by quite small

numbers (ranging from ages 8 – 80) and under the direction and expertise of our inspirational Ranger, Alec, they have spread 14 tonnes of stone over the last few months.



The volunteers had a

break in December to concentrate on bulb planting and coppicing in the woodland. Our sincere thanks to Alec, the volunteers, and Sue for organising the regular refreshments. If anyone else would like to take part in this activity then please come along and see what it is all about.
