Dear Friends

Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter. It seems that with yet more austerity on the way for Cardiff Council in 2015 the work of our group becomes more and more important: "working with the Council to protect, conserve, restore, and improve the Park for future generations".

Trouble ahead: The Friends formed in 2010 to try and work with the Council to halt the previous decade of neglect and deterioration. Together we have made a great start. However, we now face the possibility of this neglect and deterioration all over again. As of going to press, Cardiff Council are proposing a significant budget cut and 'remodelling' of the Park Ranger Service in 2015. Without the Rangers and maintenance of the Park, the habitats and facilities that we have helped to develop will be affected. Also, we rely on the Rangers for their expertise and assistance without which volunteering, organised events and educational opportunities cannot take place. That is to say, without Ranger support and presence we (and the many other Friends Groups) are not permitted to volunteer! The Committee will write to Councillors but you can also comment (initially by 12th Jan) on the budget proposals via. www.surveys.cardiff.gov.uk/budget/

We are not saying that Cardiff's green spaces are necessarily more important than other Council services, just that they and their benefits to the environment, health, education, heritage, tourism, community, etc, must receive a fair hearing. There is trouble ahead for Parc Cefn Onn - again!



Awards: Following our previous Secretary's individual runner up award in 2013 we were really

pleased to have our efforts recognised again this year by winning the G roup runner-up award for Cardiff Council's volunteer of the year 2014 at City Hall.

Our next BIG project. Everyone will have noticed that the lower pond became very silted up a few years ago and is just getting worse and worse. We are currently organising environmental surveys of the area and applying for grants to turn it into an inviting area of ecological and educational interest in 2015. If possible, we would like to include a viewing platform/dipping pond and educational information panels on habitats and plants.

Replacing our old tired benches: Despite our

efforts to preserve the benches over the years many

are now in need of replacement. We are working with the Parks Department to identify funding and a design for use



throughout the Park over the next few years.

Disappointing news: The Friends have been informed a few times this year by Park users that they have seen some adults, children and dogs running amongst the flowering bulbs the Friends have planted, damaging the banks of the streams, not clearing up dog mess, littering, and breaking parts of the historic Summer House.
