Welcome to the Friends of Cefn Onn newsletter for Spring 2025. Spring is starting to arrive, and we are now seeing bluebells, wood anemones, native daffodils and other native plants growing in the areas that were cleared of brambles last year.

Coffee shop in the Park

The Friend's group have been approached by a local charity, the Moondance Foundation, who offered a very generous grant, to use to help establish a coffee shop in the Park.

The Friends approached Cardiff Council, who were interested in this project to upgrade the former Ranger's bungalow and provide a much needed facility in the Park. The estimate of visitors to the Park is recorded as over 150,000 a year.

In December 2024, Council officials, Cllr. John Lancaster and representatives from the Friends group held a site visit to consider the feasibility of the project.

The Council will now go to tender for anyone interested on taking on a lease to refurbish the bungalow and open a cafe. The Moondance Foundation has confirmed the grant is available to be spent on provision of the catering equipment for the new café.

It's early days, but we and the Council is hopeful that the café will be open in the not too distant future.




Main Pond Clean-Up

Crocus planting in the park

In November the Friends of Parc Cefn Onn assisted the Llanishen Rotary Club in planting purple crocus corms to raise awareness of the Rotary's fight for a world free from polio.





1333 of the purple crocus corms were planted in a dedicated area in the park. Our thanks to the Rotary club and to all those who came and helped with the planting. At our February Workday we started to build hazel fencing around the planted areas to help protect them from human and animal footfall.

#86 bus route



The Friends of Parc Cefn Onn have recently written to all the councillors in Lisvane and Thornhill, the local MP and the member of the Senedd, to raise concerns regarding the possible discontinuation of the 86 bus route.

Whilst the Friends were pleased that Cardiff Bus was recently able to secure additional short-term funding for this route, we hope that it is maintained The route is the only bus service that passes near Cefn Onn.

There is a very limited frequency of buses on the route and we believe that is a limiting factor for visitors coming to this lovely natural and historic Park. There are currently only seven buses from the City centre to Lisvane and six returning buses.

The Friends have asked Friends of Lisvane and Llanishen Reservoirs and the Lisvane Community Council for their support.

It is hoped that more money can be found in the next Council budget to improve this service.

Brass rubbings

There are several brass plaques on posts around the park that can be used as brass rubbings. Many of the posts had become rotten and so the Friends group has taken them down for renovation. A couple of the plaques had been lost and will be replaced. The posts themselves will be replaced by weather-proof plastic posts.

Park sculptures

Following an ideas meeting in the Park in late 2023, it was decided to commission two wood sculptures from internationally renowned wood carver Chris Wood. Chris is planning a dragonfly by the top pond and a frog at the lower pond.
